In May, 2018, Atchison County was designated as a Certified Work Ready Community (CWRC). In honor of this achievement, a ceremony was held at the Atchison County Courthouse on August 9. Certification is based on local individuals earning a National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC) and employers recognizing the NCRC during their hiring process. The NCRC is a portable, industry-recognized credential that identifies an individual's skills in workplace documents, applied math and graphic literacy.

Earning a CWRC designation is one way to show that Atchison County employers are committed to hiring the best and brightest, and that Atchison County is proactive in the creation of a dynamic workforce.

Three Atchison County employers have signed on in support of CWRC: Community Hospital-Fairfax, Midwest Data, and Atchison County. Best in Midwest will transform the Department of Economic Development into the top economic development agency in the Midwest. This initiative will create a new strategy for economic development. It will focus on helping businesses grow and create jobs and helping workers access training and acquire skills to find employment. Addressing this need will require DED to review its programs and structure, ensuring alignment with businesses' needs.

Talent for Tomorrow will fundamentally reset Missouri's approach to meeting the state's workforce needs, across K-12, higher education, and into the labor market. The final product will include an assessment of the current workforce and how well it matches needs, deep dives into target economic sectors, economic scenario analysis, identification of pilot projects, and recommendations for an overall workforce strategy.
