



Why We MUST #ShopAC

"Shop Local" campaigns exist because as citizens of the world, with such easy access to bigger cities and online shopping, we forget how critical supporting local business is to the overall condition of our communities.

Shopping in Atchison County keeps dollars and jobs in Atchison County.

It encourages good customer service, because our businesses want and need to keep you happy and are often able to order what you want. Shopping in AC also gives you the opportunity to build community with your neighbors and helps preserve the unique character of our towns. We see cute hashtages like #ShopAC or #ThinkACFirst from time to time, but do we take this sentiment to heart?

Shopping in Atchison County supports emergency services in Atchison County.

When you spend money in Atchison County, 1/2-cent of every dollar goes to Emergency 9-1-1, and 1/2-cent goes to county law enforcement. (When you spend your dollars elsewhere, your money supports someone else's emergency services. As kind as our Omaha/Douglas County or Kansas City/Clay County friends may be, they cannot respond to your calls for help.) Shopping local first is self-preservation at its most basic level, and it helps ensure the safety of your county.

Shopping in Atchison County supports infrastructure in Atchison County.

Every time you shop in Atchison County, 1/2 cent of every dollar goes to road maintenance in AC. A portion of sales taxes in Tarkio, Rock Port and Fairfax goes to critical community needs like street repair. (When you spend fewer dollars in your town, your City has fewer dollars to spend on your streets.) In Tarkio and Rock Port, a portion of your sales taxes are used to maintain your city parks. Where do you drive every day? What parks do your children enjoy?

Shopping Atchison County enables us to keep the stores and services we have.

You may not find everything you want or need in AC, but we MUST shop at home FIRST, purposely reviewing our lists to see what we can purchase within the parameters of our county. We must commit to supporting our AC vendors, so that we can keep the stores, restaurants, service stations and other businesses in our backyards, ready and willing to serve us.

Thinking Atchison County FIRST helps you, your children, and your neighbors. Shopping at home and supporting our local businesses is something AC citizens have to commit to, now more than ever. Our most recent flooding crisis has had a real and lasting impact on our local economy, and it is critical that we retain the businesses we have, so that we can survive and hopefully thrive in the coming years.
